

# Ordinance No. 745

**AN ORDINANCE to vacate the northernmost extended portion of Leslie Avenue lying between Alexandria Avenue and a 20 foot alley adjacent to property owned by the Builders and Realty Corporation, said Leslie Avenue being a public street in the City of Alexandria, Virginia.**

WHEREAS, said vacation has been approved by the Planning Commission of the City of Alexandria and by viewers appointed by the Council of the City of Alexandria; and

WHEREAS, acting pursuant to the laws provided for in such cases, it is the opinion of the council of the City of Alexandria, Virginia, that said northernmost extended portion of Leslie Avenue lying between Alexandria Avenue and a 20 foot alley adjacent to property owned by the Builders and Realty Corporation is not needed for public use and it is in the public interest to vacate the same;

**THE CITY COUNCIL OF ALEXANDRIA HEREBY ORDAINS:**

Sec. 1 That the northernmost extended portion of Leslie Avenue lying between Alexandria Avenue and a 20 foot alley adjacent to property owned by the Builders and Realty Corporation in the City of Alexandria, Virginia, more particularly described as follows:

BEGINNING at a point, said point being the intersection of the north boundary of E. Alexandria Avenue and the west boundary of Leslie Avenue, thence following the boundary of Leslie Avenue N 6° 47' W, 121.68 feet to a point on a 20 foot alley, thence following the boundary of said 20 foot alley N 83° 36' E, 50.00 feet to a point on the east boundary of Leslie Avenue, thence following the east boundary of Leslie Avenue S. 6° 47' E, 121.64 feet to a point on the north boundary of Alexandria Ave.; thence S 83° 13' W, 50.00 feet to the point of beginning and containing 6083 square feet;

be and the same hereby is vacated, closed and abandoned as a public street and thoroughfare.

Sec. 2. That this ordinance shall be published in a newspaper of general circulation in the City not later than two days following its introduction together with a notice containing the time and place for a public hearing. The clerk of the council shall note the date of introduction and first reading, the date of publication, the date of public hearing, and the date of the second reading and final passage in the minutes of the meeting. This ordinance shall become effective the date of its final passage.
