

Ordinance No. 801

AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE to appropriate the sum of \$72,160.81 to defray the balance of the cost of rehabilitating the Cameron Street swimming pool.

WHEREAS the Cameron Street swimming pool has been closed upon the recommendation of the City Health Officer so as to protect the public health and safety, and

WHEREAS a bid to rebuild the said pool to meet the safety requirements of the City Health Officer has been accepted but there are not sufficient funds set aside to meet this expense.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF ALEXANDRIA HEREBY ORDAINS:

Section 1. That the sum of \$72,160.81 be and the same hereby is appropriated to defray the balance of the cost of rehabilitating the Cameron Street swimming pool.

Section 2. That in the opinion of Council an emergency exists and this ordinance is hereby declared "AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE" for the reason that there is a pressing need to open the said swimming pool, but it should only be allowed to open at such time as it is put in a condition that will not endanger the public health and safety.

Section 3. That this expenditure is not a regular or recurring requirement and the amount of emergency appropriation made to date does not exceed three per centum of the operating appropriations for the 1953-1954 Budget.

Section 4. That this ordinance shall be published in a newspaper of general circulation in the City not later than five days following its introduction, together with a notice containing the time and place for a public hearing. The Clerk of the Council shall note the date of introduction and first reading, the date of publication, the date of the public hearing, and the date of the second reading and final passage in the minutes of the meeting. This ordinance shall become effective the date of its final passage.
