

# Ordinance No. 908

**AN ORDINANCE to amend and reordain Section 19-120, Division 1, Article V, Chapter 19 of The Code of the City of Alexandria, Virginia, 1953, as amended, which Section 19-120 relates to PARKING METER ZONES ESTABLISHED, which Division 1 relates to PARKING METERS ON STREETS, which Article V relates to PARKING METERS GENERALLY, and which Chapter 19 relates to MOTOR VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC.**

## **THE CITY COUNCIL OF ALEXANDRIA HEREBY ORDAINS:**

Section 1. That Section 19-120, Division 1, Article V, Chapter 19, of The Code of the City of Alexandria, Virginia, 1953, as amended, be and the same hereby is amended and reordained to read as follows:

### **Sec. 19-120 PARKING METER ZONES ESTABLISHED**

The following described parts of the streets of the City are hereby established as parking meter zones:

- (a) Both sides of King Street from Lee Street to Commonwealth Avenue.
- (b) Both sides of the 100 block north and the 100 block south of each street intersecting with King Street from Fairfax Street to West Street, both inclusive.
- (c) Both sides of the 200 and 300 blocks of North Washington Street and the 200 and 300 blocks of South Washington Street.
- (d) Both sides of Cameron Street between Fairfax Street and Washington Street and both sides of Cameron Street between Columbus Street and Alfred Street.
- (e) Both sides of Prince Street between Royal Street and Columbus Street.
- (f) Both sides of the 200 block South Columbus Street.
- (g) Both sides of the 600 and 700 blocks of Duke Street.
- (h) Both sides of the 600 and 700 blocks of Queen Street.

Section 2. That this ordinance shall be published in a newspaper of general circulation in the City not later than five days following its introduction together with a notice containing the time and place for a public hearing. The Clerk of the Council shall note the date of introduction and first reading, the date of publication, the date of the public hearing, and the date of the second reading and final passage in the minutes of the meeting. This ordinance shall become effective the date of its final passage.
