

Ordinance No. 925

AN ORDINANCE to amend and reordain Section 14-3 and Section 14-5, Article I, Chapter 14 of The Code of the City of Alexandria, Virginia, 1953, as amended, which Section 14-3 relates to SPECIFICATIONS FOR RECEPTACLES FOR ASHES, TRASH AND MIXED REFUSE, which Section 14-5 relates to MISCELLANEOUS CONTAINERS FOR TRASH OR COLD ASHES, which Article I relates to REFUSE GENERALLY and which Chapter 14 relates to GARBAGE, REFUSE AND WEEDS.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF ALEXANDRIA HEREBY ORDAINS:

Section 1. That Section 14-3, Article I, Chapter 14 of The Code of the City of Alexandria, Virginia, 1953, as amended, be and the same hereby is amended and reordained to read as follows:

Sec. 14-3 SPECIFICATIONS FOR ASHES, TRASH AND MIXED REFUSE RECEPTACLES

The following shall be deemed approved receptacles that will be emptied and returned to the premises:

- (a) For ashes: A sturdy metal, water-tight container equipped with handles and a tight fitting metal cover, with a capacity of not less than fifteen nor more than twenty-six gallons.
- (b) For mixed refuse: A sturdy metal, water-tight container equipped with handles and a tight fitting metal cover, with a capacity of not less than fifteen nor more than twenty-six gallons.
- (c) For trash: A sturdy metal, water-tight container equipped with handles and a tight fitting metal cover, with a capacity of not less than fifteen nor more than twenty-six gallons.

Section 2. That Section 14-5, Article I, Chapter 14 of The Code of the City of Alexandria, Virginia, 1953, as amended, be and the same hereby is amended and reordained to read as follows:

Sec. 14-5 MISCELLANEOUS CONTAINERS FOR TRASH OR COLD ASHES

Trash or cold ashes may be separately placed in sturdy cartons, boxes, buckets, and miscellaneous containers, provided such containers do not exceed the capacity of approved receptacles described in Section 14-3 of this chapter, do not become unsturdy due to weather or other conditions, and there are at least two approved receptacles provided on the premises. All such miscellaneous containers or receptacles shall be removed along with the contents and not returned to the premises.

Section 3. That this ordinance shall be published in a newspaper of general circulation in the City not later than five days following its introduction together with a notice containing the time and place for a public hearing. The Clerk of the Council shall note the date of introduction and first reading, the date of publication, the date of the public hearing, and the date of the second reading and final passage in the minutes of the meeting. This ordinance shall become effective the date of its final passage.
