

# Ordinance No. 933

**AN ORDINANCE to vacate a portion of a public alley on the west side of the 600 block of North Patrick Street, a public street in the City of Alexandria, more particularly described below.**

WHEREAS said vacation has been approved by the Planning Commission at one of its regular meetings, and

WHEREAS a notice of application for appointment of viewers was posted at the Courthouse of the Corporation of Alexandria, Virginia, and at two other public places in the City as required by law, and

WHEREAS said viewers were duly appointed by the Council of the City of Alexandria, Virginia, and

WHEREAS said vacation has been approved by said viewers, and

WHEREAS, acting pursuant to the laws provided for in such cases, it is the opinion of the Council of the City of Alexandria, Virginia, that the portion of the public alley above mentioned and hereinafter described is not needed for public use and that it is in the public interest to vacate the same.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF ALEXANDRIA HEREBY ORDAINS:

Section 1. That the hereinafter described portion of a public alley on the west side of the 600 block of North Patrick Street, a public street in the City of Alexandria, Virginia, be and the same hereby is vacated and abandoned:

Beginning on the West side of Patrick Street 159 feet 1 inch, more or less, South of Wythe Street, being the southeasterly corner of Lot No. 2 on a plat and subdivision made by the Alexandria Real Estate Investment Trust and Title Company, and running thence South along the westerly line of Patrick Street 17 feet 7 inches, more or less; thence running west parallel with Wythe Street 90 feet to an alley 10 feet wide; thence running north on said alley and parallel with Patrick Street 17 feet 6 inches, more or less, to the southwesterly corner of said Lot No. 2; and running thence east parallel to Wythe Street and with the southerly line of said Lot No. 2 90 feet to the place of beginning.

Section 2. That this ordinance shall be published in a newspaper of general circulation in the City not later than five days following its introduction together with a notice containing the time and place for a public hearing. The Clerk of the Council shall note the date of introduction and first reading, the date of publication, the date of the public hearing, and the date of the second reading and final passage in the minutes of the meeting. This ordinance shall become effective the date of its final passage.
