

Ordinance No. 990

AN ORDINANCE granting a lease to The Little Theatre of Alexandria, its successors and assigns to use the premises located at the intersection of Wolfe and St. Asaph Streets in the City of Alexandria, Virginia, for the erection and operation of a Little Theatre thereon.

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of Ordinance No. 988, adopted on March 25, 1958, and after due advertisement of the same once a week for four successive weeks in the Alexandria Gazette, a newspaper published in the City of Alexandria, Virginia, bids in writing were received by the Mayor of said City until 7:30 o'clock p.m. April 22, 1958, for a lease authorizing the erection and operation of a Little Theatre on the land at the intersection of Wolfe and St. Asaph Streets in the City of Alexandria, Virginia, and

WHEREAS, at the open session of the City Council to receive bids, the Mayor read aloud the bid received and inquiry was made if there were any further bids to be offered, and

WHEREAS, there were no further bids offered, and the Mayor thereupon declared the bidding closed, and

WHEREAS, the bid of The Little Theatre of Alexandria, is the highest and best bid in the interest of the City and the Council favors accepting that bid, therefore

THE CITY COUNCIL OF ALEXANDRIA HEREBY ORDAINS:

Section 1. That the right to lease the City property located at the intersection of Wolfe and St. Asaph Streets in the City and construct, maintain and operate a Little Theatre thereon be and the same hereby is granted The Little Theatre of Alexandria, subject to the terms of an appropriate lease with the City containing the provisions provided for in Ordinance No. 988.

Section 2. That this ordinance shall be published in a newspaper of general circulation in the City not later than five days following its introduction with a notice containing the time and place for a public hearing. The Clerk of Council shall note the date of introduction and first reading, the date of publication, the date of the public hearing, and the date of the second reading and final passage in the minutes of the meeting. This ordinance shall become effective the date of its final passage.
